So, from a non-violent and Buddhist mindful perspective, what can we each do or say in such turbulent and divisive times? Towards the end of his political career, Richard M. Nixon once asked a young Latino busboy in the White House kitchen, "Who are you going to vote for?" The young man shared that he was voting for the other guy (John F. Kennedy). Nixon smiled and asked why and the young man responded, "Because he makes me feel good about myself and others."

How simple and yet, so poignantly significant if we are ever to bring this country together again. You see, I think that what that this young man was saying is that he felt 'seen and inspired' to not only embrace his potential, but also to aspire to help others, too, to reach their dreams and hopes. That is what this country needs and what each of us must aspire to do with everyone we meet; with those we love and with those we have been taught to fear.
